1. A

Lord Mountbatten — first Governor-General of independent India (15 Aug 1947 to 21 Jun 1948). C. Rajagopalachari was the first Indian and last Governor-General.

2. B

The Constitution was adopted on 26 November 1949 and came into force on 26 January 1950.

3. C

Dandi March (Salt Satyagraha) — 12 Mar to 6 Apr 1930 — led by Mahatma Gandhi from Sabarmati Ashram to Dandi, breaking the salt law.

4. A

First Battle of Panipat (21 Apr 1526) — Babur defeated Ibrahim Lodi using superior cavalry and matchlock artillery; founded the Mughal empire.

5. B

Vasco da Gama (Portuguese) landed at Kappad near Calicut (Kozhikode) on 20 May 1498 — first sea route from Europe to India.

6. B

Doctrine of Lapse — Lord Dalhousie (1848–56) — annexation policy if an Indian ruler died without a natural heir; led to annexation of Satara, Jhansi, Nagpur, etc.

7. A

Himalayas formed by collision of the Indian and Eurasian (Tethys closure) plates ~50 million years ago. Tectonic uplift ongoing.

8. C

Goa — smallest Indian state by area (3,702 km²). Sikkim is 2nd smallest.

9. C

Indira Point — southernmost tip of India — on Great Nicobar Island (A&N Islands). Latitude ~6°45'N.

10. A

Kosi river — 'Sorrow of Bihar' — frequent course changes; massive 2008 flood disaster.

11. **B**

Wular Lake (J&K) — largest fresh-water lake in India; on Jhelum river. Chilika is largest brackish-water lake.

12. **C**

Black soil (Regur) — Deccan trap origin, rich in calcium, magnesium, potash — ideal for cotton. Also called 'black cotton soil'.

13. **B**

India's first Vande Bharat sleeper rake commenced commercial service in May 2026 on Mumbai–Ahmedabad route after trials Dec 2024 onwards (Ministry of Railways).

14. **B**

Nobel Physics 2025 → John Clarke, Michel H. Devoret, John M. Martinis for macroscopic quantum mechanical tunnelling in superconducting circuits.

15. **C**

Operation Brahma — India's HADR response to the 28 Mar 2025 Mandalay earthquake (Myanmar) — NDRE, IAF C-17/C-130 deployment.

16. **C**

Leena Nair (CEO, Chanel since 2022) reinforced her position as India-origin woman head of a global firm; further appointments (Sumithra Hema HCL etc.) confirmed in 2026. Indra Nooyi (former Pepsi) retired 2018.

17. **B**

Khelo India Youth Games 2025 (7th edition) was hosted by Bihar (Patna, Rajgir, Begusarai) in May 2025. Bihar edition extended as the 2026 reference (per MoYAS).

18. **C**

IQAir 'World Air Quality Report' (May 2026) again ranked New Delhi the most polluted capital, with annual PM2.5 around 100 $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$.

19. **A**

India's first hydrogen fuel-cell train pilot run on the Jind–Sonapat route (Northern Railway, Haryana) — flagged off 2026 by MoR.

20. **A**

Samantha Harvey — Booker Prize 2024 (announced 12 Nov 2024) for 'Orbital'. Held into May 2026 reference window.

21. **A**

Om Birla re-elected Speaker of the 18th Lok Sabha on 26 June 2024 (second consecutive term).

22. **B**

Pravasi Bharatiya Divas 2025 (18th edition) was hosted in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, on 8–10 Jan 2025.

23. **C**

CSO advance estimate (May 2026) pegged FY25 GDP growth at ~7.0–7.2% — moderation from 8.2% in FY24.

24. **A**

CP Radhakrishnan (former Jharkhand Governor) sworn in as 15th VP of India after Jagdeep Dhankhar's resignation in July 2025.

25. **B**

WHO declared Mpox a PHEIC for the 2nd time on 14 Aug 2024 (clade Ib outbreak in DRC and neighbouring countries); status continued through 2025–2026.

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
